### Collection sessions, Monday 1 July


We were pleased to be able to offer delegates some sign-up sessions using the University of Reading's collections and archives, and about projects that inform collections upkeep and usage.

#### Isotype and Publishing

An exhibition featuring work by the Isotype Institute relating to the publication of 'soft propaganda' during the Second World War, information books for children, and publishing in British colonial West Africa in the 1950s. Items on display, which include publications, preparatory material, and correspondence, are from the Otto and Marie Neurath Isotype Collection, given to the University of Reading by Marie Neurath.

#### For Dom, Bruno and the Amazon

Dom Phillips (journalist) and Bruno Pereira (indigenous expert) were murdered in June 2022 whilst carrying out research for Dom's second book, *How to Save the Amazon: Ask the People Who Know.* The exhibition highlights some of the key threats faced by the Amazon and its communities. Dom's book is set to be published in April 2025.
