

## PARTICIPANT DATABASE INVITATION

Thank you for participating in a study at the Centre for Integrative Neuroscience and Neurodynamics (CINN) at the University of Reading. We hope you enjoyed the experience.



Here at CINN we have research happening all the time, on different topics, and using different methods to measure your brain.

If you are interested in joining in with other studies, you can sign up to our participant database. This means you will be added to a list of people and we will tell you about other studies you could do.

### **Will other studies be with the same researchers?**

The other studies might be with the same researchers you met in this study, but they might be with different researchers. You will be told who is running each study so you will know if it is new people before you agree to join in for each one.

### **Do I have to join the database?**

No, you do not have to sign up the database. It is your choice. You can ask as many questions as you like to help you make your choice. You can still join in other studies without signing up to the database.



### **Do I have to take part in more studies?**

No, being on the database does not mean you have to take part in any other studies. If we contact you to let you know about a study, it is up to you to decide whether you want to be involved or not.

### **Can I change my mind?**

Yes, if you change your mind, you can tell us or tell your parent. We will remove you from the database. You do not need to say why you have changed your mind.



### **Is it definitely safe?**

For each study, you will get information about what it will involve and how safe it is. You will be able to make your choice whether you want to join in with the study after you have been told how safe it is. You can ask questions about each study.
